The Wood-block of *Hokekyō* in Meiji Period: About *Nichirenshū Daikyōin Version*

The *Nichirenshū Daikyōin Version* is one of the *Hokekyō* published in the Meiji period. This *Hokekyō* was published by Arai Nissatsu, from the origin of *Nichirenshū Daikyōin*. The wood-block of this *Hokekyō* is stored at *Tanjōji* in Kominato, Kamogawa City. The first wood-block was published in 1880 as *Daikyōin Version*. By the change of ownership of Suharaya, whom they took charge of printing and marketing the book of sutra, it was clarified that the wood-block had some changes made. The second wood-block is the version of small sized; furthermore, it is revealed as the wood-block of the *Hokekyō* published in 1889. The first wood-block is the *Ichibukyō* which only one *Hokekyō* is printed, and the second one is the *Sanbukyō* which combines *Kaikyō* and *Kekkyō*. The third wood-block is a *Yōhon*, the collection of the major parts of *Hokekyō*. *Nichirenshū Daikyōin* was altered its title to *Nichirenshū Daidanrin* in 1884. However, the three types of *Hokekyō* as written above, became widespread as *Nichirenshū Daikyōin Version*, for Arai Nissatsu revised its title.
